Release Readiness and Response Card

Use this card for a change with meaningful customer, data, reliability, dependency, or operating risk. It helps a team choose the lightest release control that makes exposure responsible and makes the response visible before the rollout begins.

Keep the team's existing release, security, privacy, incident, and change-management systems authoritative. This card is a client-neutral working aid, not a substitute for them.

01 RELEASE HYPOTHESIS

WORKING PROMPT

We believe [named user or operating group] can use [specific change] to accomplish [specific outcome].

We will expose it through [release control].

We will know the release is behaving as intended when [observable condition].

If [warning or stop condition] occurs, [named owner] will [rollback, limit exposure, use fallback, or pause].

PROMPT

RECORD

Change and intended outcome

Customer or operating group exposed first

Most consequential credible failure

Reversibility of that failure

Easy / costly / hard to reverse

Decision owner for increased exposure, hold, or rollback

02 CHOOSE THE LIGHTEST RESPONSIBLE CONTROL

SITUATION	CANDIDATE CONTROL	WHY IT FITS THIS RELEASE
Lower consequence and easy to reverse	Normal deployment + normal monitoring	
Unknown behavior and easy to reverse	Feature flag, small cohort, or controlled internal release	
Customer workflow, data, or hard-to-reverse risk	Prove risky path, rehearse response, define fallback

Staged rollout, explicit owner, decision gate before broader exposure

1. What is changing, and for whom?
2. What is the most consequential credible failure?
3. What limits exposure?
4. What signal tells us to continue, pause, or reverse?
5. Who owns the next decision and communication?

05 RETIRE TEMPORARY COMPLEXITY**TEMPORARY CONTROL OR
WORKAROUND****WHY IT EXISTS****OWNER****REVIEW
DATE****KEEP / SIMPLIFY / REMOVE****BOUNDARY**
